Georgie Spring Barley

I. Georgie is a two-rowed, rough awned spring barley that is short, with midseason to late maturity. Its growth habit is semi-erect with a tapering head. Georgie has long hair rachilla, white aleuron and a glabrous ventral crease. It is resistant to lodging, and resistant to European leaf rust races.

- II. Georgie is adapted to the northwestern Great Plains areas of the United States.
- III. Distinguishing characteristics of this variety are its bevel lemma base and absence of ventral groove hair. Strong anthocyanin in the lemma nerves during growth.
 - IV. Breeder seed will be maintained by North American Plant Breeders. Certification seed classes will be restricted to Breeder, Foundation, Registered and Certified.
 - V. Application will be made for Plant Variety Protection. Still pending is a decision as to whether or not to specify sale only as a class of certified seed.
- VI. Certified seed will be offered for sale in 1975.
