

Idaed: Idaed is a common soft white spring wheat. It is an early, short, medium-stiff strawed wheat. Idaed has a beardless white chaffed head. This variety is resistant to shattering but is susceptible to common spring wheat diseases in Eastern Washington. Idaed matures from 7 to 10 days earlier than other spring wheat varieties. In the higher rainfall areas, it is well suited to late seedings on heavy soils and early seedings on shallow soils. Idaed is recommended for spring seeding in the 12-inch and higher rainfall area for late seedings on irrigated land of Central Washington. Idaed is not recommended in the Goldendale area. The lack of uniformity in head height at harvest time sometimes makes it a problem to harvest.

Marquis: Marquis is a short to medium tall, medium stiff, white strawed, common hard red spring variety with a beardless, yellow-chaffed head. It is early to mid-season in maturity. Marquis is resistant to lodging and fairly resistant to shattering. Its harvesting characteristics are satisfactory, but the grain yield is not as high as other adapted spring wheats in Eastern Washington. Marquis is a recommended variety in Western Washington.
