Lemhi 66

Lemhi 66 is a common, soft, white, spring wheat with resistance to all races of stripe and stem rust presently found in southern Idaho. It is a tall, white-chaffed variety with slightly weaker straw than Lemhi 53. In the absence of stripe or stem rust, Lemhi 66 will yield essentially the same as the earlier Lemhi types or Federation. Where stem or stripe rust is a factor, it will out-yield the other varieties. Lemhi 66 has milling and baking qualities similar to the earlier Lemhi types.

Seed Stocks: Sizeable stocks of registered seed were released to growers in the spring of 1966. Reasonable supplies of registered and certified seeds are available for planting in 1967.
