

REPORT OF THE NATIONAL CERTIFIED SMALL GRAIN VARIETY REVIEW BOARD

The National Certified Small Grain Variety Review Board has considered the application for certification of Profit 75 Hard Red Spring Wheat and has concluded that this variety is eligible for certification.

PROFIT 75

Botanical and objective description of Profit 75:

Profit 75 is an early, awned, mid-tall hard red spring wheat (*Triticum aestivum* L. em. Thell. ssp. *Vulgare* (Vill., Rose) MacKey) having the following botanical characteristics:

- Stem: white, mid-strong, hollow
- Spike: white awns averaging 76 mm. in length; oblong, mid-dense, inclined and resistant to shattering
- Glumes: glabrous, white, long, wide; narrow square to elevated shoulders; narrow, acuminate beaks averaging 6 mm. long
- Kernels: red, mid-long, hard and ovate; mid-sized germ; mid-wide deep crease; rounded cheeks; mid-sized, mid-long non-collared brush

Area of adaptation and primary use of the variety:

Profit 75 is adapted to the hard red spring wheat belt. Its primary use will be in the white bread-making industry.

Seed classes:

World Seeds, Inc. will maintain the Breeder seed class in California and North Dakota. Generations of seed will include Foundation, Registered and Certified.

Application is being made for a certificate of Plant Variety Protection, not specifying sale only as a class of certified seed.
