Wheat: Rall was bred specifically for the Oklahoma Panhandle and western counties where wheat streak mosaic virus (wsmv) has been a major problem for growers. The new wheat variety, selected from a Scout variety, is moderately tolerant to wsmv.

Rall is equal to or slightly better than Scout 66 in grain yield, milling and baking qualities, and reaction to diseases other than wsmv. It also appears to have a high degree of drought tolerance.

The new wheat variety was released by Oklahoma State University. Rall seed for growers should be on the market this year.
