Soft Red Winter Varieties

Triplet is well known to the wheat producers as a good dependable yielder. It has good milling quality and can be used in a wide variety of bakery products; for this reason, some millers would like to have more of it grown. It has fuzzy chaff and is susceptible to bunt.

Jones Fife, like Triplet, has fuzzy chaff and is susceptible to bunt. It did not yield as well as Triplet.

Mosida, a high yielding variety, is susceptible to bunt and shattering.

Red Russian is a tall, late maturing variety which is fairly resistant to lodging. It is susceptible to bunt, winter kills easily, and is low in both yield and test weight.

Carlson Fife has a very tall, coarse, and stiff straw with large heads. It has yielded unsatisfactorily at both Pullman and Pomeroy. It shatters easily, is susceptible to bunt, and is low in test weight.
