OVERLAND is a mid-season white spring oat. It matures earlier than Victory and the straw is 6 to 12 inches shorter. It is more resistant to lodging than Victory and usually yields more in the recommended area. Overland is recommended in southwestern Washington.

EAGLE is a mid-season spring oat that heads five to six days earlier than Victory in northwestern Washington. The straw is 4 to 8 inches shorter than Victory and more resistant to lodging. The kernels are white and medium plump to slender. Eagle has outyielded Victory at all locations in northwestern Washington. In southwestern Washington it has not performed as well as Overland. Eagle has performed exceptionally well on peat soils. It is recommended on peat soils throughout western Washington and on other soils in northwestern Washington.
