

WINTER WHEAT VARIETIES

Centurk is moderately early and matures about the same time as Lancer. It resists leaf and stem rusts and has good straw strength. Under field conditions that produce 30 bushels or more per acre, it yields more than other named varieties in Wyoming. Below 30-bushel levels, it yields less than Cheyenne, Shoshoni and Warrior. Winter survival is comparable to Scout.

Lancer is a hard red winter wheat with good straw strength and test weight. It matures earlier than Cheyenne. Lancer is resistant to stem rust, but susceptible to wheat streak mosaic, loose smut and leaf rust. It is slightly less winter hardy than Cheyenne.

Scout 66 is similar to Scout in many respects except Scout 66 is more winterhardy than Scout which is an advantage under Wyoming conditions. Scout 66 is resistant to stem rust, early, has medium plant height and is high in yield.

Trapper is a mid-season variety similar to Warrior in most characteristics. It is slightly taller than Warrior, but superior to it in test weight. It is resistant to stem rust, yet susceptible to leaf rust, bunt and wheat streak mosaic. Winter hardiness of Trapper appears equal to Warrior.
