1985 HATTON WINTER WHEAT

Based on the need for adequate stock seed to produce a certified class of Hatton winter wheat in 1986, and confirmation of a true shortage of registered Hatton for fall 1985 planting. (A major source of $F \longrightarrow R$ was rejected in the field). WSCIA and WSU have allowed a $C \rightarrow C$ production for 1986 fall harvest. Now a major source of certified class Hatton, intended for planting in fall of 1985 as stock seed for 1986 certified, has shown a non-uniform varying content of white wheat kernels. The sources are fields W435-789ABCD (Kayson's, Inc.) totaling 575 acres. A precleaned sample from these fields shows 4/pound white wheat (eligible for certified class). Four further official samples have shown 5, 7, 6, and 6 white kernels per pound. Of necessity, WSCIA allows certification of this seed from W435-789-ABCD (Kayson's, Inc.), and eligible to produce certified class seed for fall 1986. Subject to the condition that WSCIA can make a special field inspection of Hatton winter wheat seed fields using this stock seed to assure off-type plants are properly rogued. This ruling effects:
