

'Corbin'

Hard Red Spring Wheat

'CORBIN' is a common hard red spring wheat adapted to the Pacific Northwest and Montana. 'CORBIN' was developed by WestBred, from the cross "Border/Conan".

'CORBIN' is a semi-dwarf hard red spring wheat. The head is strap shaped, middense, awned and inclined at maturity. The chaff color is white at maturity and the stem is semi-solid. The glume shoulders are elevated with an acuminate beak. The seed is hard, red, and elliptical with rounded cheeks. The brush is medium and collared.

A variant that is similar to 'CORBIN', but is 10-15 cm taller, may occur at a frequency of up to .2% (20 per 10,000 plants). A white seeded variant may occur at a frequency of up to .2% (20 per 10,000 seeds). An awnless variant may occur at a frequency of up to .1% (10 per 10,000 plants). Otherwise no other variants are known to occur. Application for Plant Variety Protections will be made and the Title V option will not be taken.
